Aim: This course is aimed at providing students basic resources to develop an active job search in a proactive, organised and planned way, regarding both working for others or preparing the basis of an entrepreneur project, in the framework of renewable energies and rural environment. The main goal would be to offer practical information, methodology and examples through practical exercises to start building their own careers-path for a short and medium term.

Description of the parts

Each module is organised in three chapters. The first chapter of module 1 will be devoted to introduce strategies and resources for job search, whereas chapter 2 is aimed to build the basic tools in a job search process: CV and cover letter. Finally, the last module will go in-deep with self-knowledge: competences (soft and hard) and strengths, and how to face the final part of the selection process: the interview.

The second module will be devoted to entrepreneurship: to provide students of an overview about this topic. Furthermore, students can be aware of their own competences to become a (intra)entrepreneur and how to enhance them. Basic knowledge of the recent methodology to build up a business plan is offered. And last but not least, some interesting resources and examples transform an idea to a project. Each module includes some comprehensive exercises and examples adapted to the field energy in rural areas.

Start here

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After logging in, please download the text and get an overview of the module by reading the introducing summaries at the beginning of each chapter. Like that, you can get a general idea of the content. Also note that a Bibliography has been introduced at the end of each module in which students will find interesting references with complementary information.

Also along the text, one can find links and images that can be tracked for further information. It is quite important to follow the original order of the material, because it has not been drawn up randomly.

When you have finished a subchapter, please go to the Tasks section and prepare your exercise, and send it in time. You have a commented example for each exercise.

As you are expected to deliver 100% of exercises please check that you have fulfilled all tasks:

Module 1: Deliver exercises: Chapter 1: 2.3.1, 2.3.2; Chapter 2: 1.3.2, 1.3.3; 2.3.2; 2.3.3

Chapter 3: 1.2, 2.2

Module 2: Deliver exercises: Chapter 1: 1.3.1 Chapter 2: 2.3.1 or 2.3.2 Chapter 3: 3.3

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Assessment

Students can only obtain the certificate of the course (including the 2 modules) if the following conditions are fulfilled:

- They have delivered all exercises using the Moodle Platform, (tasks delivery) in time.
- They have obtained 50% of mark in all exercises and has a positive evaluation from the teachers involved.
 - Each exercise will be supervised by the teachers teaching their corresponding module and can give guidelines and propose improvements through Moodle Platform.
 - The exercises corresponding Module 1 must be delivered (data limit) the last day of the module (by second week of June: 18th June). Those corresponding Module 2 must be delivered the last day of the module (data limit) (by the last week of June: 2nd July).
